Pet Travel – Advanced Preparation & Things to Know Before you Go

This document contains general information and points you should consider when arranging international travel for your pet.

Please note:

Medical procedures for some countries such as UK, Australia, New Zealand, Malta Japan, Sweden and some others must begin much longer in advance of departure date (up to 7 months). Please see "country specific" data for advice on when to start planning your pet's veterinary procedures such as microchip, rabies vaccines & rabies immunity tests

Flight bookings will not be confirmed by airlines until close to flight date (within a week or so) and Export certification is often valid for only 10 days. *Flights* cannot be booked before this time.

Specific data and transport procedures for individual countries can be detailed and confusing for the occasional traveler. We strongly recommend that you choose an IPATA agent such as British Veterinary Centre to organise your pet's travel. Members of this organisation are familiar with international animal transport requirements and local procedures and liaise with each other to coordinate efforts from departure to arrival.

Travel Cages

- Use only IATA approved cages. (All BVC cages are IATA approved)
- Measure generously when calculating cage size undersize cages will be declined by all major airlines
- See measurement page on this document for details of how to measure your pet (it works for cats and dogs)

Pregnancy

• Animals in the last third of pregnancy may be barred from traveling.

Tranquilisers

- Rarely needed.
- Use only on fit and healthy pets and under veterinary guidance.
- Some breeds are more sensitive to tranquilisers than others. Be especially careful with brachycephalic breeds (Boxers, Pekes, Pugs etc.) talk to the vet first.

Breeds

- 1. Some fighting breeds are barred from entry to various countries. This varies between different destinations but check if you intend to transport:
 - Pit Bull (which includes the American Pit Bull Terrier also known as the American Pit Bull and Pit Bull Terrier
 - American Staffordshire Terrier, Staffordshire Bull Terrier,
 - American Bulldog
 - Japanese Tosa
 - Dogo Argentino
 - Fila Braziliero
 - Perro De Presa Canario
- 2. Short nosed (brachycephalic) breed such as Boxers, Pekingese and Persian cats are increasingly refused transport by airlines.

Vaccine Requirements

- Rabies is a standard vaccine requirement for most counties
- Other vaccines are frequently demanded.
- Rabies vaccine is required in dogs and cats both to enter and to leave the UAE.

Travel Documents

- Documentation procedures can be simple for some countries where only a current rabies vaccine status is requested
- Countries such as Australia, New Zealand and United Kingdom require more involved application procedures.
- Some countries need Embassy or UAE ministry attestation
- UAE
 - o Ministry import permit is mandatory for pets entering the UAE
 - Ministry export health certificate is mandatory for all pets leaving the UAE

Local Transport Services from BVC in UAE

- To / From Airport
- Between Emirates

Veterinary Health Checks

- Performed at the BVC routinely (you may visit any time but we prefer you to make an appointment as this can save waiting time).
- Can be built into your transport plan.
- Mandatory requirement for most journeys
- Timing can be important Too long before departure flight and the export documentation will expire. Too close to departure time and there won't be time to get the paperwork complete
 - Some countries accept certification dated up to one month before travel while others insist that your certificate must be no more than 2 days old.
 - Friday and Saturday are weekend days in the UAE and ministry work will not take place on these days. Health Certificates

Note: We can issue or obtain all documents required for your pet's trip.

Age Limits

Many countries and airlines insist that traveling cats and dogs should be no less than 4 months old.

Feeding / Water

- Do not feed your pet for 6 hours pre-flight. Healthy pets can go many hours without food and 36 hours is well within the capacity of normal pet dogs and cats.
- Water should be offered up to the departure time but need not be placed in the cage as well. Instead, you should
 - o arrange a water bowl attached to the inside of the cage with a small piece of pipe secured such that water can be given without opening the door.



- Attach feeding and watering instructions to the cage for ground staff to follow in the event of long flights or delays
- Ask us for advice if your pet is older, unfit or has any complaint that might require special feeding or watering instructions.

How to BRITISH AIRWAYS WORLD CARGO MEASURE YOUR

This is a mandatory requirement for British Airways

INDEX

- A. From the tip of the nose to the root of the tail
- B. From the elbow measurement to the ground
- C. The width at the widest point
- D. From the floor to the tip of the ears or the top of the head, whichever is higher (ears must not touch the top of the kennel in animal's natural standing position)

A+1/2B = Length Cx2 = Width

GUIDELINES

- . Must be fit and in good health
- · Must have up to date veterinary health certificate
- . Must not be more that six weeks pregnant, or less than eight weeks old
- · Start the arrangements for travel several weeks before

- Check with your local British Airways World Cargo office or www.baworldcargo.com in case of change of regulations
